Since our children deserve nothing but the best, we have been ambitious with our plans to make our new library a focal point for the school and the curriculum we deliver.

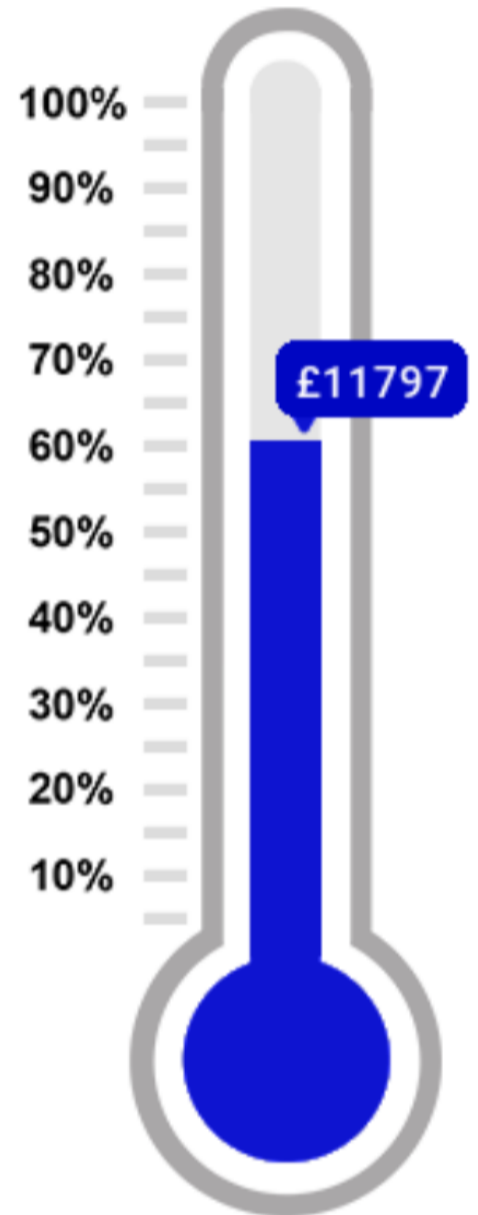

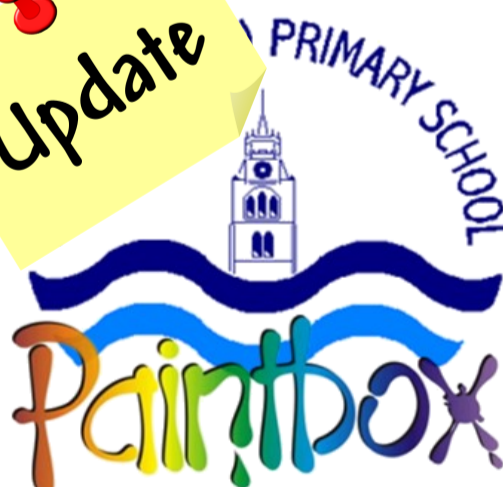

Update



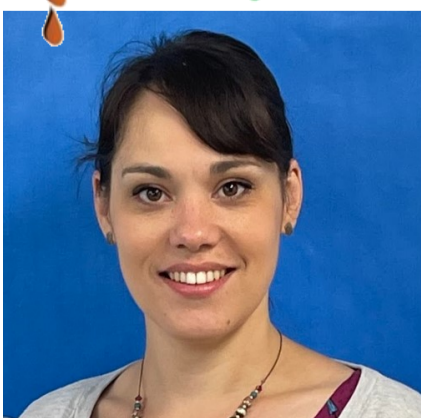

## PAPERLESS PUPIL REPORTS

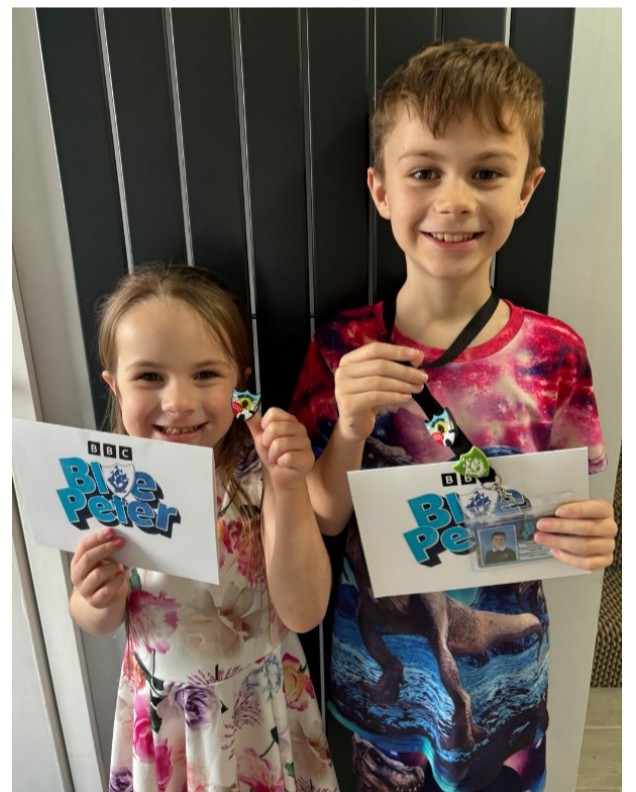


As always, at the end of this academic year, parents and carers will receive a progress and attainment report for each of their children.

School success starts with attendance

Attendance levels since the start of the academic year, the pupil attendance for those pupils of statutory school age currently sit at 95.15% - 1.73% higher than at the same point last year.

This is really pleasing and highlights the commitment of the school and its families to ensure the pupils of Sutton get the best start to their education.

Nevertheless, there is always room for improvement! We are still experiencing incidents of unauthorised absence, particularly relating to term time holidays, and a small number of pupils who are not getting into school before 8:55am.

Please do ensure children are in and arrive promptly so as to avoid missing valuable learning time. If your child is ill, do please notify the school office as soon as possible.

The bottom table provides a breakdown of attendance by Year group. As you can see, Year 2 has the highest attendance at present. Reception has the best punctuality.

The last column shows the number of pupils with attendance below 90%. This means each of these children have missed more than 8 days already this academic year.
