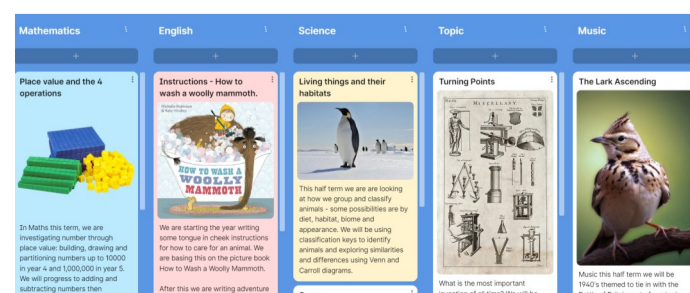

On Tuesday Salamanders, Wolves and Tigers visited Duxford Imperial War Museum for the day. They had a fantastic time and even got to see spitfires taking off and landing while eating lunch. They were lucky to go on a quiet day and had 2 fantastically knowledgeable guides to take us round. They explored WW2 planes and listened to a re-enactment of a battle in the 'ops room'. They learnt the history of some of the most famous planes at Duxford including a £6million Spitfire; learnt how Doodlebugs worked and laughed at the development of a 'bomber' (the first few pilots had to stand up - while steering- and literally throw it over the side of the plane!) Salamanders got to see the inside of the work room and walk through Concorde while Wolves and Tigers spent time exploring tanks on the front lines. This has given plenty of inspiration for their English units - look out for some fantastic writing from these classes over the coming weeks.
