



Summary of responses in Parent Survey (September 2021)

The revised School Values, Behaviour Policy and School Rules have placed a significant emphasis on being safe and respectful towards each other. Staff and pupils are aware of these rules and how they are expected to adhere to them. Where these expectations are not met, the school has a clear approach in managing these behaviours so as to ensure they do not persist.




