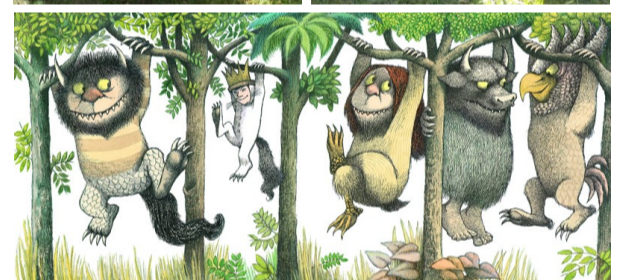
CATERPILLAR METAMORPHOSIS COMPLETE!

KEY STAGE 2 PUPILS ENJOY MUSIC & DANCE WORKSHOPS

Year 3/4/5 pupils had a history workshop focussing on music and dance. We learnt about the instruments people played in folk music were fiddles, recorders and squeeze boxes. We also learnt a dance the Molly-Men would do. We have been making Jig-dolls, which are dancing wooden dolls from East Anglia. They were made to dance to the music for entertainment, they would dance to folk music. Folk music was sung to warn people about things or for celebration.

We made our jig-dolls out of cardboard, drew out the shapes that we needed for our character, we cut them out then joined them with glue and string. We had to use layers of cardboard for the body because they would have originally been made from wood and we wanted ours to be able to dance.

We wrote our own folk songs and are going to make our jig-dolls dance to the music.
