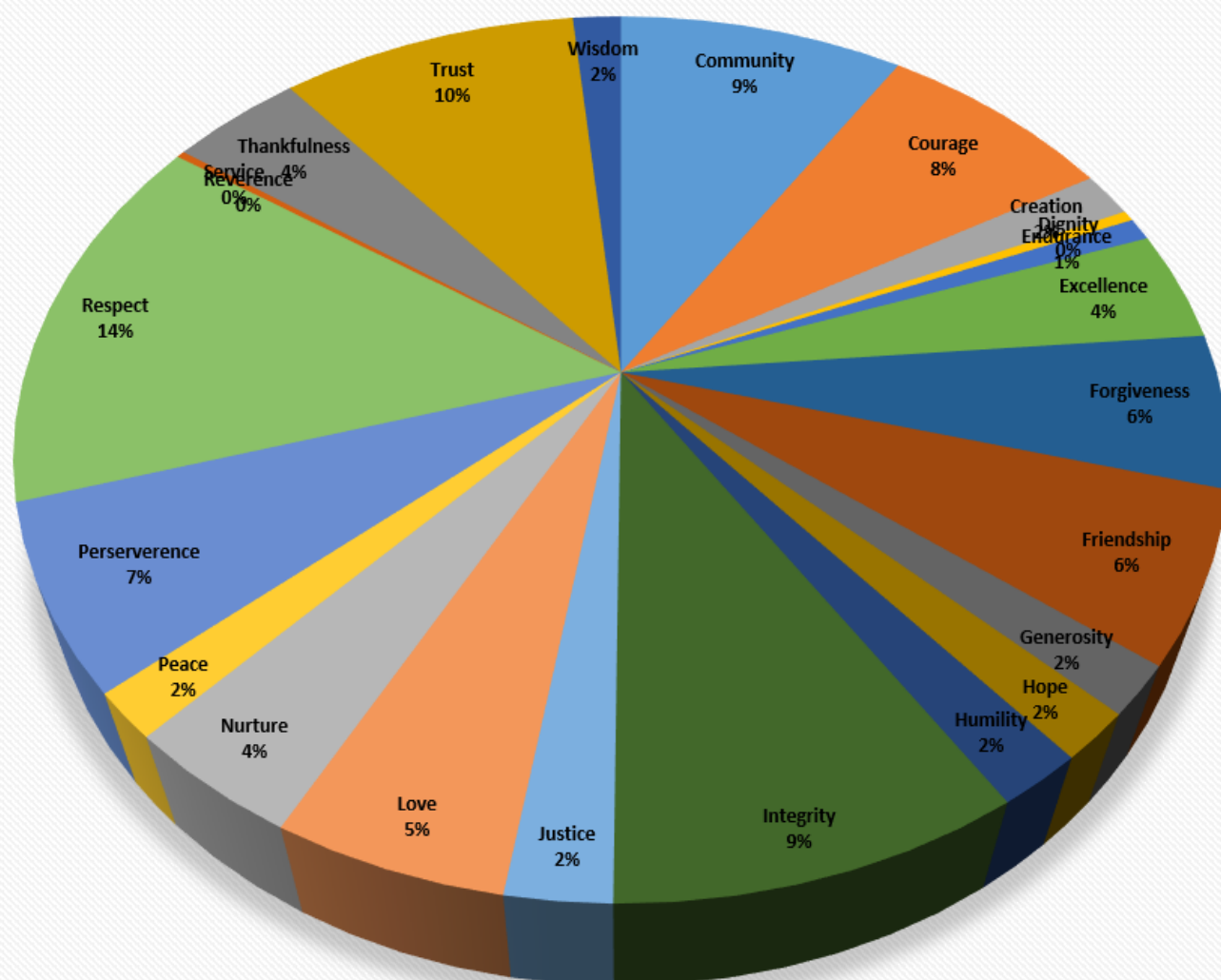


SCHOOL COMMUNITY SHARE THEIR THOUGHTS ON REVISED VALUES
