

Redirection – gentle encouragement to do the right thing.

©Reminder – after giving the child time to process the redirection they will be reminded of what is expected.

oCaution – calmly tell the child privately your expectations

oTime in – in peaceful place in classroom or the reflection garden

o Educational consequence – time spent during playtime to discuss the desired behaviour in class.

∘Internal referral – time in – 10 minutes in a partner class with work provided by the class teacher.

oReparation – for an educational consequence or internal referral. Chance to set positive goals for the future.




Year 1/2 Curriculum Overview Autumn Term

What is unique about the Fens?

Maths- We will learn about place value, understanding that numbers can be broken down into tens and ones. We will also look at addition and subtraction skills using these concepts. Finally, we will explore basic shapes, recognising and describing their properties, such as sides and corners.





English- We we will be learning about what makes a sentences. Our book of the term will be Here We Are by Oliver Jeffers.

Geography- We we will be learning about the local area. We will looking at human and physical features.

History- We will be looking at how houses have changed over the last 100 years. What were houses like 100 years ago?

Computing -We will be using technology to take photos. We will also learn about camera esafety

RE- Who made the world? We will be looking at the Christian story of creation.

Art- We will be learning about the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo, who drew people using fruit.

DT- In DT, we will learn about Farm to Fork. We will look at how our food gets to our shops and what grows around us?

PSHE-Rights, rules and responsibility is our topic for PSHE. We will also be exploring the idea of diversity and community.












Numbots

NumBots is an online maths learning platform that helps children learn how to add and subtract, improving their fluency and recall in basic mental maths, and equipping them with maths confidence. NumBots covers subitising, number bonds, and addition and subtraction of double-digit numbers; gradually helping pupils to build a solid conceptual understanding of number sense.





Our school uses Little Wandle a to teach early reading and spelling











We work on Phonics screening style words throughout the year so children will be used to sounding out and blending as part of their ordinary routine.






Spelling


- -Each week, your child will be given 10 spellings to learn, focused around a spelling rule which will be tested during the week.
- -Spellings will be set and sent home on a Monday and tested the following Monday.





Handwriting

Each week, your child will be taught at least 2 sessions of handwriting. KSI focus on a printed approach, beginning cursive approaches in Y2, with the aim of all handwriting being legible and joined (a requirement to achieve age-related expectations in Y6 SATs).



RE

Understanding Christianity is a fun programme for children to learn about the Christian faith. It covers key topics like Creation, Jesus' birth, and Salvation in simple ways. The core units use stories and pictures to help children understand these ideas. We will explore these topics through activities and discussions that encourage questions and thoughts about their own lives. Our goal is to help children appreciate Christianity and understand different beliefs while making learning enjoyable. We also cover other world faiths by using The Emanuel Project.

Were you aware that last year 20% of the children in Cambridgeshire who were eligible for a Free School Meal did not do so?


Currently a school will receive £1,300 per pupil claiming Free School Meals. This money is called Pupil Premium Funding and can be used to support the child's education in the form of smaller classes, TA support, if necessary or funding to help the pupil's parents to meet the cost of school trips. This additional income is only received by the school if you apply for Free School Meals, however, please note that your child does not have to have a Free School Meal if they would prefer not to.
