animal – a living thing that can move and eat and react to the world through its senses.	sight – the ability of our eyes to see and understand the world around us
hearing – how we perceive sound	smell – using the nose to perceive odour
mammal – animals that give birth to babies rather than laying eggs, and feed their young with milk.	taste – the ability to detect the flavour of substances using the mouth
odour – another word for smell.	texture – how something feels when it is touched
senses – the 5 senses (sight, hearing, smell, taste, touch) allow us to observe and understand the world around us.	touch – the ability to perceive texture and temperature usually through the fingertips.
