Dear Parents/Carers,

Well, we have finally reached the end of another academic year. It feels clichéd to suggest the end of this year is a relief, but in some ways it very much is! There is no doubt it has been significantly influenced by Covid and has made life challenging for us all, but there is still so much to celebrate. Without wishing to tempt fate in anyway, the fact there have been no bubble closures in school for the entirety of this year is an amazing achievement. Believe me, there are not many schools who can make a similar claim. Working collaboratively as a community has enabled us to ensure the impact of Covid on our children's education has been reduced significantly.

This leads me onto the next achievement.
