Ofsted Report

On Tuesday we were able to release our most recent Ofsted Report following our school inspection at the end of term.

School Day

Our school day starts at 8.55 am and finishes at 3.00 pm.

Pupils and parents may start to arrive at school from 8:45am. We operate a 'staggered start' system and it is possible to leave children with their classteachers from 8:45am.

We have electronic registration in all of our classes. Pupils arriving after the registration has closed should go to the school office to notify the office staff of their arrival in school.

We politely ask that parents dropping children off do not wait near the doorways and gate ways as this ensures that all the exits are kept clear and allows all the children and teachers the opportunity to enter and exit the buildings in an orderly manner.

Absence from School

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school we ask that parents notify the school. This can be done by leaving a message on our automated phone system; the school number is 01353 778351.

Our school policy, in conjunction with health advice, is that a child suffering from sickness or diarrhoea should remain away from school for a full 48hrs **after** all the symptoms have stopped.

We do follow up any absence that we have not been told about but our efforts often end in failure due to parents not keeping their contact details current and up to date.

Please tell us if you change your details.

Violin Lessons

I am delighted to welcome Mrs Fiona Dagg to our school. Mrs Dagg is a music teacher who will be offering to teach the violin to pupils who would like to learn.

Nuts

We have pupils at our school who have a severely allergy to nuts. Contact with nut based products will cause these pupils to become very ill. As a consequence our school community is a 'nut free' environment.

Parents of pupils who bring a packed lunch need to be aware that **no** nut based products are permitted. Please read the labels of products carefully as food items like chocolate spread are often made with a nut based product.

Holidays during Term Time

Our school Attendance Policy clearly states that we aim to minimise the amount of time lost to term time holidays through a policy which actively discourages parents from arranging family holidays during this time. Parents should not expect leave of absence to be granted automatically as leave for the purpose of a family holiday will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and not for multiple requests during a school year. If leave of absence is taken without authorization, it will be recorded in the schools attendance register as an unauthorised absence and may be referred to the school's Education Welfare Officer.

Absence during term time interrupts the continuity of teaching and learning and disrupts the educational progress of individual children. In a week lots of things can happen within the life of a school; children can miss whole areas of a topic being taught in maths or English. In addition the social aspects of a child's development including their friendships can move on making it difficult for the returning child to fit back in with their peer groups.

Parent Consultations

Each term there is the opportunity for parents to meet with their child's class teacher to discuss their progress. This term our Parent Consultations are on:

All appointments are 10 minutes in length. Appointments can be made by contacting the school office. Please note appointments cannot be made on the day of the consultation; this allows staff time to prepare for this event. It is not necessary for parents to attend every consultation held during the year.

Better Reading Partners

School Dinners

The cost of a cooked school meal is £2.15 per day. This is an increase of 10p from meals taken during the last school year.

Payment for a school meal must either be received in advance or on the day that the meal is taken.

Please note it is no longer possible to pay for a meal after your child has had their meal.

The School Menu issued at the end of last term is still valid for this term. We are still waiting for the additional copies of the menus, we hope that they will be in school shortly.

There is a large copy of the menu on the wall as you approach the school office from the playground entrance.

Please note the half termly amounts include a meal on 15.09.14. and have been calculated to allow for INSET Days when the school is closed to children.

Pupils in our Foundation Stage and KS1 are entitled to a Free School Meal under the new scheme introduced by central government on 1 September 2014.

It is possible for KS2 pupils to have a Free School Meal; a list of criteria is used to assess each individual application. If you think that you may be entitled to Free School Meals please call into the office to ask for a form.

As a school we are entitled to additional school based funding when a child is eligible for Free School Meals so please do apply if you think you may be eligible.

Dogs on the school grounds

Unfortunately it is not possible to bring dogs onto our school grounds. In the past few years we have seen a number of dogs react 'out of character'

when on the crowded playground and as a result we now ask parents and carers to refrain from bringing their pets onto the school grounds.

Yr 6 Transfer to Secondary School

It hardly seems possible that we are beginning to think about our current Yr 6 transferring to secondary school. However, the transfer process is beginning shortly and it is important that families spend time thinking about this decision. Last term our Yr 6 pupils left to attend the following schools:

Ely Community College St Bedes School Witchford Village College. Wisbech Grammar School

Staff from Witchford Village College will be visiting our school on Tuesday 16 September to talk to our Yr 6 parents and pupils about their school and the transfer process.

The meeting will start at 3:30 pm and should last approximately 1.5 hrs. The meeting will be held in the school hall.

Witchford Area Schools Partnership (WASP)

Our school is part of the Witchford Area Schools Partnership (WASP). The Partnership is made up of the 7 primary schools, 1 special school and 1 secondary school that are located within the catchment area for Witchford Village College.

Over the last few years the Partnership has been working on a number of key issues collectively rather than each individual school working on these issues separately. Issues covered include:

- Yr 6 Transition to Secondary School
- Special Educational Needs
- Sharing good practice
- Inter-school sporting events
- Sharing Policies

Leaflets

During the course of the year the school is often asked to distribute leaflets to parents which promote different activities for children taking place in and around the Sutton area.

Parents need to be aware that when engaging with these companies they should always check that the leaders are DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) enhanced checked and cleared. The school does not undertake these checks unless the organisation is working as part of the school or WASP provision.

Money for School

Please can parents place all money that is for any of our school activities, including school dinners, in a sealed envelope with your child's name and class on the front.

All monies can be taken to your child's class teacher.

There is also a black metal post box in the corridor outside our main office where parents can deposit payments.

Please remember payments for school meals can be made online using the Agora Payment System. This is a safer way to make payments. Details about this site will be sent to our new parents shortly.

Harvest Festival

We will be holding our annual Harvest Festival on Tuesday 7 October at St Andrew's Church. Pupils will be asked to come to school in the usual way and will be registered in their classes before lining up to walk to St Andrew's Church en masse.

When we walk to the church we use a 'family grouping' system whereby our older pupils walk with our younger pupils. However we do require a lot of adult/parent helpers to help supervise the pupils as we walk to the church. If you can help on the morning of Tuesday 6 October please contact your child's class teacher.

This year we would like the children to bring harvest gifts of non-perishable food – tins, bags of dried goods etc.

Please do not send your child to school with fresh food.
