




Parent feedback is always welcome and a survey will be circulated in due course to establish how informative the consultations were for you. Keep a look out for this on ClassDojo.


YEARS 5 & 6 GET TO THE HEART OF THE CIRCULATORY SYSTEM

We are very mindful of community concerns surrounding rising cases of Covid both locally and nationally and we are keen to allay fears as much as we can. We have seen an increase in the number of pupils testing positive this week, but these have been isolated to specific classrooms. Although this indicates some level of transmission in school, it does highlight how effective our ongoing protocol has been in keeping transmission rates down across the school as a whole.

Cambridgeshire does have increasing rates, but our pupil attendance last week remained inline with regional and national levels. This is testament to your ongoing support and we'd like to thank you for the measures you are also taking to help keep our school safe and operational.

We will continue to inform parents of confirmed cases within their child's respective classes as soon as possible via ClassDojo. This doesn't necessarily mean specific action is required, but do be vigilant in looking out for symptoms





Congratulations to Stan and Harry in Year 6 who have successfully completed the subtraction module of Success@Arithmetic. Well done boys, keep up the excellent work!
