

	Minutes of FGB meeting 16 th March 2020	Action: Clerk to carry forward Minutes of FGB meeting 16 th March as agenda item on next FGB meeting.
4.	Headteacher verbal report	EGR presented her verbal Headteacher report.
		One of the biggest challenges has been the management of expectations of staff working from home. It was decided for the first two weeks, an easier approach would be taken.
		LA has given EGR a update each day, including information on budgets, free school meals vouchers, statutory processes such as exams, support hub, regional hub (if long term), info about admissions and arrangements for NQTs. Unions have issued guidance for NQTs also.
		It was explained that performance management shouldn't continue as previous while schools are closed and teachers shouldn't be judged in the same way while home learning. It has also been announced that NQTs should be able to pass as normal.
		An NQT at the school has enough evidence to show she is able to pass.
		A safeguarding briefing was provided which includes a new bereavement protocol during these new measures. EGR and staff are drafting this and meeting Monday to discuss.
		Update on expenditure – The school is not running too many additional costs. EGR is looking at the budget for the next financial year and the potential loss of income. Budgeting the worst case scenario until this information is known.
		Q – a governor asked if EGR is taking in to account any money FOSS would have had for summer fetes. No, don't normally budget for that as separate bank account so accounted for separately.
		Q – a governor queried that there is no money coming in for free school meals but still a contribution to lunchtime providers? The existing school caterers have ceased trading temporarily. One member of catering staff is continuing to cook and provisions are being bought by school.

Issue Raised
Q – a governor asked if that catering staff member still gets paid furlough?
Yes all catering staff being paid furlough.
Universal infant free school meals should continue even though closed so we should receive funding as usually would. Furlough isn't an option for school staff. Income for paid meals will be a loss while closed.
The school will provide paid meals for skeleton staff and children during this time.
EGR explained they have been in touch with the Poor's Land Trust for any possible contribution.
The TAs are conducting cleaning across the school in morning and afternoon, then the cleaners come in 2-4pm, ensuring they are keeping away from children and staff. Cleaning staff are working through the Easter break and are bringing
forward the time they would be working through the summer holidays to work through the Easter holidays instead. Cleaning staff iwere thanked for the good work being done as the school is looking very clean.
Wellbeing: A Zoom team meeting was held with staff. EGR talked through a comms note sent to staff to help with health and wellbeing while working from home, including alot of useful advice.
EGR raised the difficulties for the skeleton staff who are still working in school with much reduced contact with other staff members and how to deal with that.
[BW left meeting at 7.30pm.]
Home learning A home learning team has been set up. 6 members of staff working from home for the duration and are in charge of home learning planning for the various years. EGR set expectations for what this should look like and has provided a good balance of level of work expected of teachers working from home. Realistic and manageable.
RG has circulated guidance from the LA regarding personal protection within a wellbeing action plan.
SATS are cancelled, however the school has been thinking about standardisation.

	Q – a governor asked what the take up of homelearning has been like from
	children at home. Good conversations with staff. PW and RG have both been very tenacious with parents who are not engaging as well as expected.
	10 children are on a watch list, red/amber level, and staff keeping a close eye on them.
	There are a few key children that staff are concerned about as they have not heard from them at all, and considering mental health concerns in some families they need to keep in touch with them. EGR explained there is one case where they are encouraging a family to send their child in to school as there is currently capacity.
	The school has received one negative feedback where families have mixed age children, and find the expectations are very different and very difficult to manage teaching for those families. After Easter home learning will be looking at whole school themes and how these can be adapted to each age group.
	Home learning leads are giving feedback for one piece of work per child per day. This seems to be standard across schools. There has been good take up so far.
	Q – a governor asked if EGR is aware of any children who have got COVID 19 within the family. This is not information that is sent to us. Not aware of confirmed cases.
	Some staff unwell but no confirmed cases. A governor highlighted that she is aware of a family with an unconfirmed case and will send this information to EGR.
	EGR explained numbers of children in school range from between 3 -14, but most days 10 children attend. Usually at least 6 – 7 every day, but some children are not in every day.
	The mobiles and some classrooms are closed and are keeping children in family groupings. There are only 6 within each classroom.
	There is a team rota to keep people working together on the same days to reduce contact. There are also separate staff in over Easter so get 2 weeks off after Eater.
	EGR covered handover arrangements with the new HT.
5. Schools Financial Value	The SFVS document was circulated prior to the meeting and presented virtually on screen by EGR.
Standard (SFVS)	SRu asked if governors had any questions.
, ,	Q – a governor asked why 'the average teacher cost' was red and down as 0. Why is this not complete? EGR says this was calculated.
	Action: EGR to find this figure and circulate.
	EGR clarified that this came out medium as much higher proportion than average are on upper pay scale.



6. Policy Approval Levels	Ssue Raised Q - a governor asked why the 'Pupil to teacher ratio' is in lowest 10% of schools. EGR explained that this is correct as currently have 11 classes and this is not financially viable. Currently have 2 small reception classes, which brings down average class sizes. Q - a governor asked why some text in the checklist is in red. What is the significance? This is an error and is just previous highlights that need to be taken off. Q - Q23 - "still some internal audit matters in hand" EGR explained this is in reference to the fact that when the school had the new finance system and new finance officer, it wasn't possible to provide accurate data so governors couldn't challenge. Q - Section D on Dashboard 'predicted change in 3 - 5 years', why 0? SFVS is based on current budget, more about potential, not actuals. This is only referring to reductions not increases. Action: EGR to change B6 to say 'potential increase'. Accepted with changes made. SRu introduced the policy approval level document circulated prior to the meeting. This has been developed and reviewed by SRu and CS. Q - a governor asked is the Invacuation Policy the same as a Lockdown Policy. EGR - yes. A governor asked if the school has a Curriculum Policy. Is there an umbrella policy covering the curriculum? EGR clarified that RG as new Acting Deputy has put together a new Teaching and Learning Policy. Action: Clerk to add Draft Teaching and Learning Policy on agenda for
Approval	SRu introduced the policy approval level document circulated prior to the meeting. This has been developed and reviewed by SRu and CS. Q – a governor asked is the Invacuation Policy the same as a Lockdown Policy.
	A governor asked if the school has a Curriculum Policy. Is there an umbrella policy covering the curriculum? EGR clarified that RG as new Acting Deputy has put together a new Teaching and Learning Policy.
	Q – a governor asked if the school has an Educational Visits Policy, or included in H&S Policy? EGR explained that it is in the H&S Policy. The governor clarified that it used to have to be a statutory policy on its own but can now be included within H&S policy. It wasn't apparent from the list, but ok as long as provided within H&S policy, which it is.
	Q – a governor asked if there is a risk assessment policy. Yes, is included within the H&S policy.



	EGR explains all policies will be made available on GSuite so all governors
	will have access in future.
	A governor asked about two policies that are not included in the statutory list, but are a requirement in the Early Years Framework. - Missing Child policy
	- Uncollected Child policy. EGR clarifies the school has an Uncollected Child protocol. The Attendance Protocol includes a Missing Child protocol.
	The governor clarified that the Missing Child policy refers to a situation where a child goes missing from school premises or offsite such as from a school trip. These two policies are a requirement of the Early Years Framework, and
	must be available to parents either via the website or parents handbook.
	EGR confirmed an Uncollected Child policy is available and will make available to parents.
	Action: EGR to ensure the Uncollected Child Policy is made available to parents and consider the Missing Child Policy.
	Q – a governor asked if 'Managing allergies and dietary requirements' is covered within basic foods in school. EGR thinks the managing allergies part comes under First Aid and Managing Medical Conditions policy, but will check with Sam Brown. Action: EGR to check which policy 'Managing allergies and dietary requirements' is included.
	A governor explained that Schools should have a policy or protocol on staff use of cameras and mobile phones and questioned where this is included. EGR explained that the GB approved a Camera and Mobile Phones policy in 2019. Q – a governor asked if this also covers restrictions on children bringing mobile phones in to school. Yes, it does.
	Action: EGR to get Camera and Mobile Phones Policy added to the website.
	Q – a governor asked if vehicle movements on school premises is included within the H&S policy. Yes, it is.
	Q – a governor asked if the school has a Whistleblowing Policy? Yes we have two. One for child protection and one for financial whistleblowing
	Q - a governor is aware the school has a SEN policy, but is there a gifted and talented policy? There is an element of this included within the new draft Teaching and Learning Policy, it is not a standalone policy.

	d) <u>LAC Policy</u> Q – a governor highlights that there is only the smallest of mentions of virtual school and virtual HT, this should be more prominent. Also the role of designated teacher during virtual school. There is a responsibility of the role of virtual HT to liaise and this needs to be more prominent.
	Change required: Action: LAC Policy: EGR to look at the section regarding the virtual school and role of virtual HT and consider in more detail.

	Q – a governor question why some text is highlighted in blue on pg. 10 "our school". EGR mis-heard the query and answered The teachers will raise any concerns on My Concern if have any concerns of any new children being taught on site. The gov concerned realised it was simply where the cursor had rested!
	Q – a governor asked if this was valid only during the current time or will it need updating and mentioned that specific staff were named Yes. Some lead names are on website so not a GDPR issue.
	Q – a governor asked how the policy will remain up to date in changing circumstances. Lead teachers to be alert and aware of any changes and update accordingly. LA talking about hub working where some schools close and staff drafted in
	to other schools. A draft has been prepared and some potentially affected schools have been approached. DECISION: The Governing Body approved the COVID-19 Safeguarding
	addendum.

This is a big move forward for anyone who would benefit meeting virtually in the future knowing it is now possible Able to function as a GB and continue to support the school during these times. Reconfiguring the policy schedule and having these in order – with thanks to SRu for her efforts with this. A positive shift in training and governor visits prior to school closure that would likely have been maintained if possible. It is emphasised to governors to continue training and support of the school where possible during these times. All governors being kept up to date with measures being taken tackling COVID-19. Thanks to EGR and all staff for these efforts. Governors have been able to discuss the SFVS and it is highlighted that there are so many positive rag ratings. EGR explains she has had to delegate some things during the past few weeks such as reaching out to parents and staff, which she wished she could have done more of herself but has just not had the capacity.
