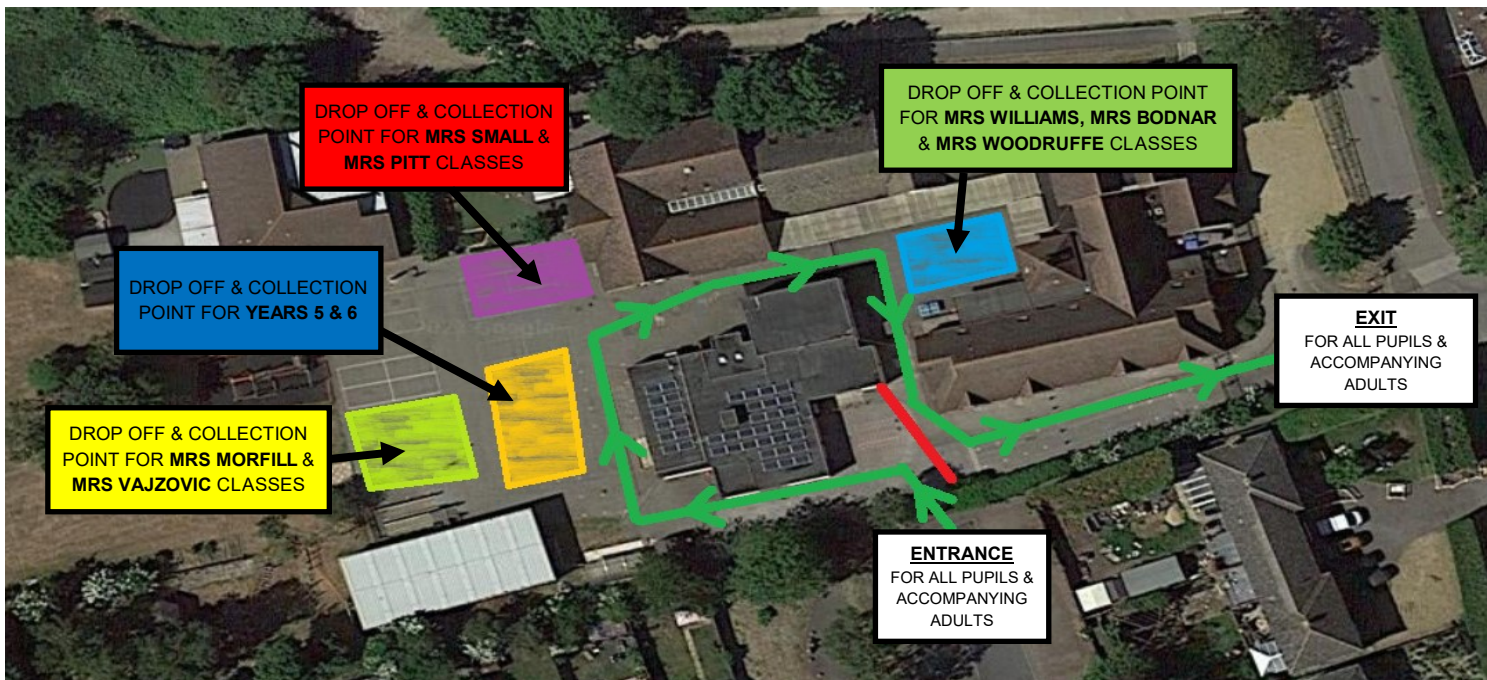

WELCOME BACK!

As announced in last week's 'Sutton News', parents will be able to accompany their children onto the school grounds from Monday 28th June. Thank you to everyone who has been in touch regarding these revised arrangements—your input is very much appreciated.

For this to work and ensure Covid-19 risks remain low, it is imperative the following guidelines are adhered to:

- All children and accompanying adults are to enter the school site via the Bellairs gate. We politely request that only one adult from each household comes onto the site at a time.
- All adults accessing the grounds will be required to wear a facemask unless they have been advised not to do so by a medical professional.
- Social distancing between households and other bubbles is to be maintained on the school grounds at all times.
- Adults and pupils are to strictly adhere to the one way system around the school grounds. This has been indicated by the green line on the map above.
- Drop off and collection times for respective year groups will remain the same as they are at present. Teachers will not supervise pupils until the scheduled times outlined below so please avoid accessing grounds too early.

- Adults dropping children at multiple bubbles are encouraged to drop off pupils in order of collection times ensuring pupils are under the supervision of their class teacher.
- Parents will be able to pass through barrier (red line on map) supervised by staff member if they need to go around onto the main playground again.
- All children and accompanying adults are to exit the school grounds at the end of the one way system at The Brook gate.

There will be adults stationed around the grounds so please do ask if you're unsure about what you are doing or where to go. Please be assured that this new system will be closely monitored and areas identified as an unforeseen risk will be addressed immediately. For this reason this, please be aware this may be subject to change.

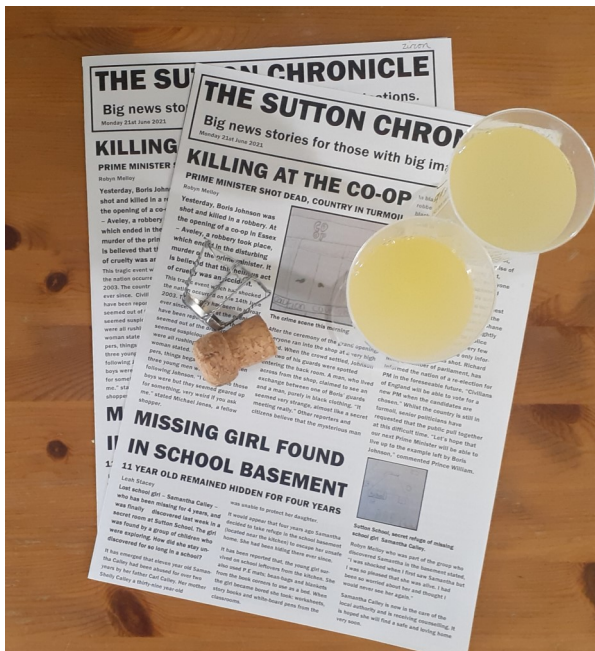
