Absence from School

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school we ask that parents notify the school. This can be done by leaving a message on our automated phone system; the school number is 01353 778351.

Our school policy, in conjunction with health advice, is that a child suffering from sickness or diarrhoea should remain away from school for a full 48hrs **after** all the symptoms have stopped.

We do follow up any absence that we have not been told about but our efforts often end in failure due to parents not keeping their contact details current and up to date.

Violin Lessons

I am delighted to welcome Mrs Fiona Dagg to our school. Mrs Dagg is a music teacher who will be offering to teach the violin to pupils who would like to learn.

Nuts

We have pupils at our school who have a severely allergy to nuts. Contact with nut based products will cause these pupils to become very ill.

As a consequence our school community is a 'nut free' environment.

Parents of pupils who bring a packed lunch need to be aware that **no** nut based products are permitted. Please read the labels of products carefully as food items like chocolate spread are often made with a nut based product.

Harvest Festival

We will be holding our annual Harvest Festival on Tuesday 7 October at St Andrew's Church. Pupils will be asked to come to school in the usual way and will be registered in their classes before lining up to walk to St Andrew's Church en masse.

When we walk to the church we use a 'family grouping' system whereby our older pupils walk with our younger pupils. However we do require a lot of adult/parent helpers to help supervise the pupils as we walk to the church. If you can help on the morning of Tuesday 6 October please contact your child's class teacher.

This year we would like the children to bring harvest gifts of non-perishable food – tins, bags of dried goods etc.

Please do not send your child to school with fresh food.

Holidays during Term Time

Our school Attendance Policy clearly states that we aim to minimise the amount of time lost to term time holidays through a policy which actively discourages parents from arranging family holidays during this time. Parents should not expect leave of absence to be granted automatically as leave for the purpose of a family holiday will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and not for multiple requests during a school year. If leave of absence is taken without authorization, it will be recorded in the schools attendance register as an unauthorised absence and may be

referred to the school's Education Welfare Officer.

Absence during term time interrupts the continuity of teaching and learning and disrupts the educational progress of individual children. In a week lots of things can happen within the life of a school; children can miss whole areas of a topic being taught in maths or English. In addition the social aspects of a child's development including their friendships can move on making it difficult for the returning child to fit back in with their peer groups.

Parent Consultations

Each term there is the opportunity for parents to meet with their child's class teacher to discuss their progress. This term our Parent Consultations are on:

All appointments are 10 minutes in length. Appointments can be made by contacting the school office. Please note appointments cannot be made on the day of the consultation; this allows staff time to prepare for this event. It is not necessary for parents to attend every consultation held during the year.

Leaflets

Parents need to be aware that when engaging with these companies they should always check that the leaders are DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) enhanced checked and cleared. The school does not undertake these checks unless the organisation is working as part of the school or WASP provision.

Money for School

Yr 5/6 Trip

Our Yr 5/6 pupils went on a trip to Ely Cathedral and Museum on Wednesday. The visit was designed to support the children's learning about the local area including the Littleport Riots and the building of the Cathedral itself.

It was lovely to hear that during the trip the school staff received many positive comments about the pupils' behaviour whilst they worked in the Cathedral and Museum.

Creating a new cycleway from Witcham to Wentworth

Work starts next week (week commencing 22 September) on the construction of a new 1.5km foot and cycleway which will complete the cycle path link between Sutton and Ely.

Cambridgeshire County Council plans to build the new route between Sutton and Wentworth alongside the A142. The new path will provide a segregated or low traffic route from the village of Sutton-in-the-Isle all the way to Ely.

A 2m wide dual use foot and cycle path will be constructed between Sutton and Witcham Toll and a path between 1 and 1.5m will link Witcham Toll to Witchford. The paths will provide a separate and largely segregated route for pedestrians and cyclists alongside a busy A-road where no current path exists.

Works are expected to take around 2 months to complete. The new cycleway is anticipated to cost £350,000 and will be funded from the DfT's Local Sustainable Transport Fund, which aims to improve links between employment sites and residential areas.
